

St. Scholastica Academy has four valedictorians

One hundred forty-three students received diplomas May 16 from principal Mary Kathryn Villere in the Msgr. Joseph Chotin Center at Our Lady of the Lake Church, marking the 106th graduation of St. Scholastica Academy. Father John F. Talamo celebrated the graduation Mass, assisted by Deacon Dan Dorsey.

The class of 2009 has received more than \$7.4 million in scholarship offers and has been accepted to 69 universities and colleges in 19 states.

The four students named valedictorians were Lisa Brady, Michelle Duplantier, Danielle LeBlanc and Mackenzie Schott.

Brady, daughter of Rose and Claude Brady Jr. of Folsom, will attend the University of Alabama and major in international studies. She was a National Merit Finalist and received numerous scholarships from the University of Alabama, including the National Merit Achievement Special Scholarship, Presidential Merit and National Merit, Study Abroad or Summer Research Scholarship and Fellows Experience Scholarship.

She also received scholarship offers from Millsaps College, Mississippi State University, Rhodes College, Southern Methodist University and Texas Christian University.
