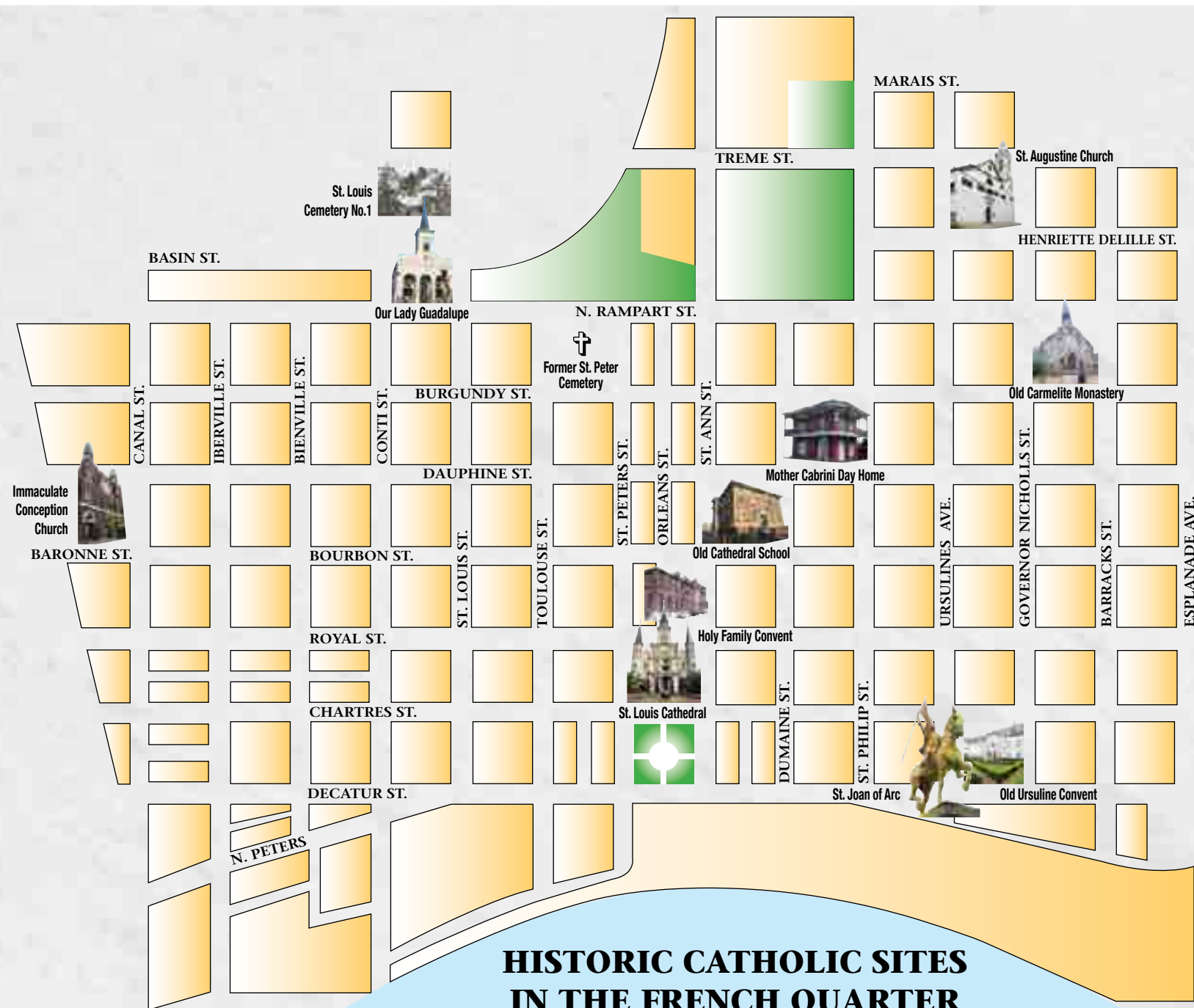

HISTORIC CATHOLIC SITES IN THE FRENCH QUARTER

*The Archdiocese of New Orleans (1793) is the second-oldest diocese in the United States
 Historic locations date back to 1718:*

- St. Louis Cathedral - 1718
- Ursuline Convent - 1745
- St. Louis Cemetery No. 1 - 1789
- Our Lady Guadalupe - 1826
- St. Augustine Church - 1841
- Holy Family Convent - 1842
- Immaculate Conception Church - 1851

- Old Cathedral School – *Built in 1867 by the Religious Sisters of the Sacred Heart, who took over Cathedral School in 1884.*
- Old Carmelite Monastery - 1891
- Mother Cabrini Day Home - 1892
- St. Joan of Arc - *Given to city in 1972; moved to French Quarter location in 1999.*
